Understanding How Children Learn to Read

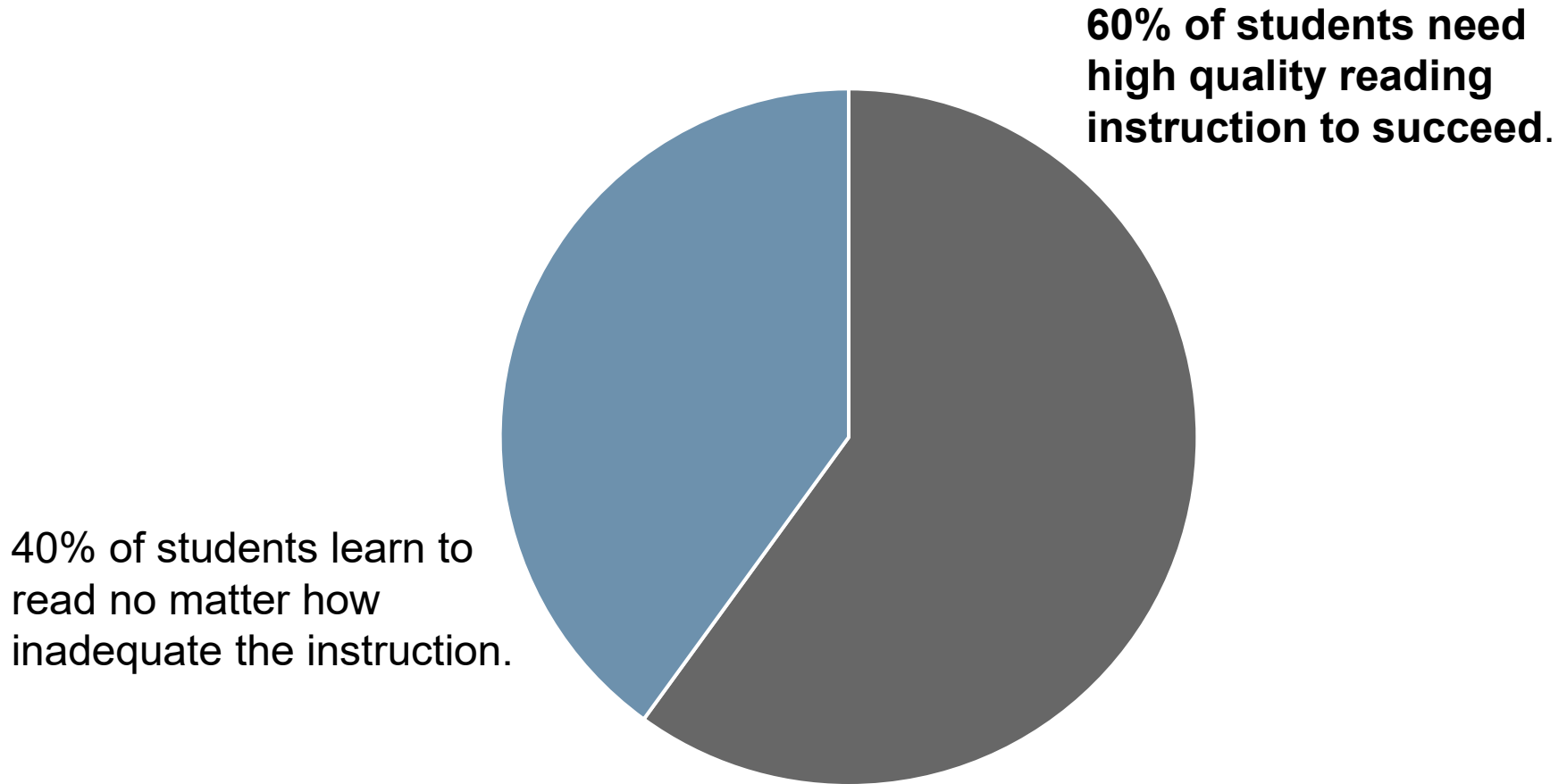


Aligned with the Science of Teaching Reading

Language acquisition is natural.
Reading acquisition is taught.

- Explicit instruction from a teacher focused on how sounds and print are related is key to reading.
- Early text reading opportunities align with phonics instruction.
- Quality literature is a necessary component of a well-rounded reading program.
- “Do not wait.”

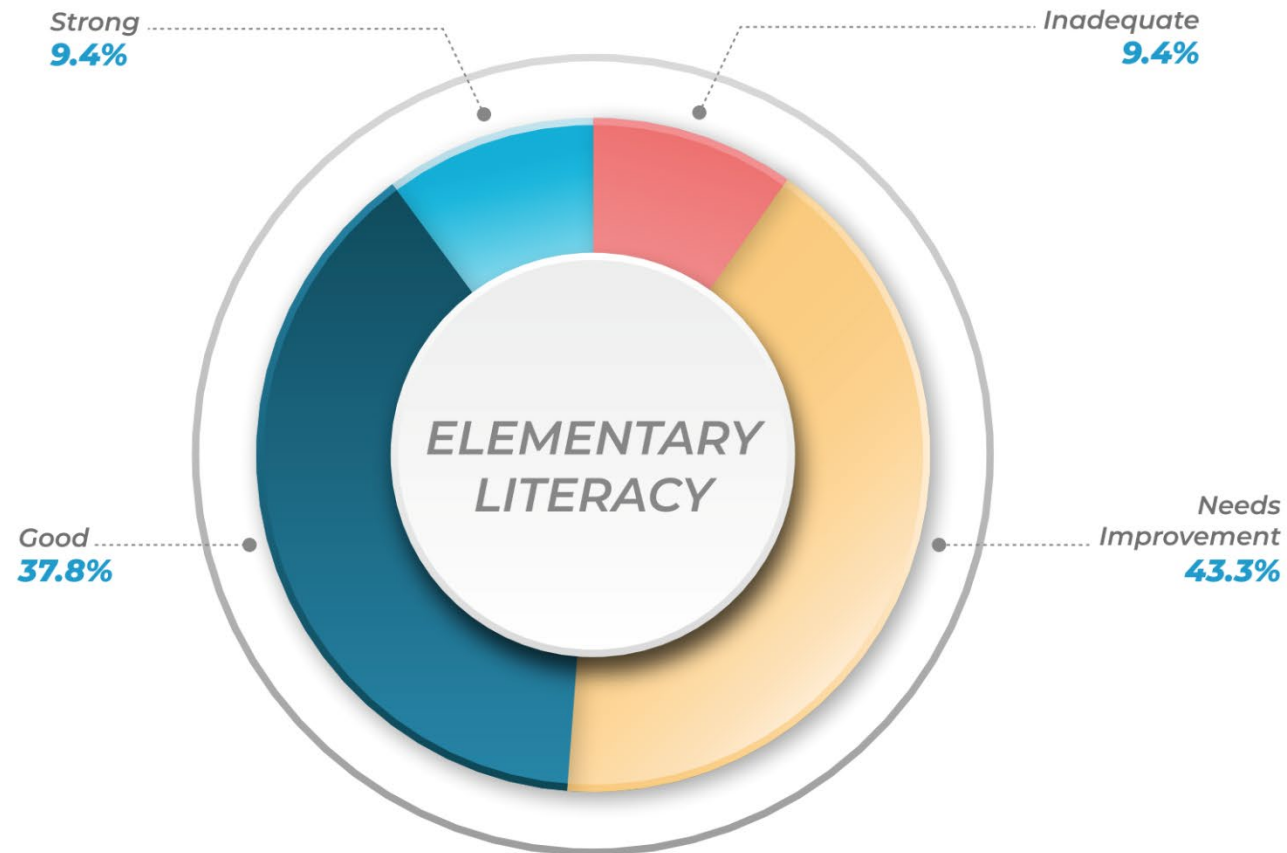

Results of Efforts Focused on Tier 1 Reading Instruction

2017-2019 Gains

- 1st in nation
 - 4th grade reading
 - 4th grade math
- 3rd in nation
 - 8th grade math
- 4th in nation
 - 8th grade reading
- Exceed national average for proportion of students with disabilities at or above proficient in 4th grade

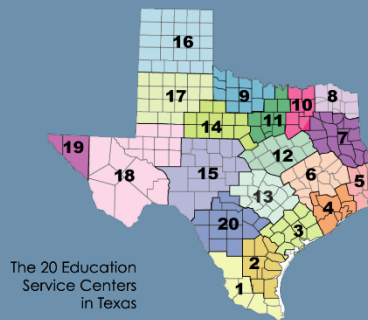

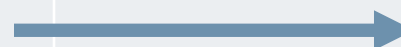
